(1) Uses permitted in C-2 Districts shall meet the standards set forth in article IV pertaining to offstreet parking, loading requirements.

(2) Any type of business in a C-2 Zoning District must conduct all its business inside an enclosed building and/or inside an aesthetically pleasing barrier, as prescribed by the planning commission, which will shield the business activity from the view of passing motorists and surrounding property owners. No such barrier shall be constructed without the written approval of the planning commission following the procedures set forth in this chapter for the granting of variances. All finished products of such businesses shall be kept inside an enclosed building or behind such barrier.
