

REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS

City of St. Marys, Georgia

The City of St. Marys, Georgia will accept proposals from firms wishing to provide professional services for disaster debris removal services.

Responses to this RFP must be addressed and delivered to the City of St. Marys Finance Department, 418 Osborne Street, St. Marys, GA 31558 no later than **July 26 at 2:30 pm (EST)**. The proposals will be opened publicly at this time and vendor's names will be read aloud. Proposers must submit three (3) copies in a sealed package clearly labeled with the submitting company's name and address, as well as the words "**Disaster Debris Removal Services**" on the outside of the envelope. Any proposal not received by the deadline, or not marked appropriately, will not be opened for consideration. Neither faxed nor email submissions will be accepted. No proposal may be withdrawn for a period of ninety (90) days after the above opening date.

It is the purpose of this RFP to secure a contract for debris removal in the event of an emergency pursuant to all applicable FEMA regulations.

All required Contract Documents and proof of meeting the City's Insurance Requirements must be fully completed and executed by the Contractor and his/her Surety, and submitted to the Owner on or before the issuance of Notice to Proceed.

The City of St. Marys will select the proposal that, in its sole discretion is the most responsive and responsible to the City. The City is not liable for any cost incurred by vendors in the preparation of this proposal.

Unauthorized contact regarding this request for proposals with staff or elected officials may result in disqualification. Any oral communications will be considered unofficial and non-binding on the City of St. Marys. Vendors should rely only on written statements.
